

Grifols Donation Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy

This Grifols Donation Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy (“CHD Policy”) supplements the [Privacy Policy | Grifols Plasma](#) (the “Privacy Policy”) and applies to information defined as “consumer health data” (“CHD”) by the Washington state My Health My Data Act (“MHMDA”) and Nevada’s Consumer Health Data Privacy Law (“Nevada CHD Law”) (collectively, “CHD Laws”). Undefined capitalized terms shall have the meaning in the Privacy Policy. “Grifols,” “we,” “us,” and “our” refers to Biomat, USA, Inc. The “Services” refers collectively to our plasma donation services, our website at www.grifolsplasma.com, and our DonorHub app.

Categories of CHD Collected

As described further in our [Privacy Policy | Grifols Plasma](#) (and depending on applicable law and your interactions with us, we may collect the following categories of CHD, as broadly defined in the CHD Laws.

- We may collect some or all of the following information in connection with your screening for eligibility to donate plasma and/or whole blood (“Screening”), including as part of our collection of your medical history and physical examination:
 - Individual health conditions, treatment, diseases, or diagnoses (e.g., current medications, immunization records, disease history)
 - Social, psychological, behavioral, and medical interventions (e.g., surgical interventions)
 - Health-related surgeries or procedures (e.g., surgeries or procedures you have undergone)
 - Use or purchase of prescribed medication (e.g., list of medications you are currently taking)
 - Bodily functions, vital signs, symptoms, or measurements of health information (e.g., blood pressure, pulse, temperature, height, weight, blood type, drug test results)
 - Diagnoses or diagnostic testing, treatment, or medication (e.g., current medications, disease history)
 - Gender-affirming care information (e.g., if any of the surgeries or procedures you report in your medical history are gender-affirming in nature)
 - Reproductive or sexual health information (e.g., pregnancy test results)
 - Genetic data (e.g., where such information is included in medical history)
 - Other information that may be used to infer, derive, or extrapolate data related to the above or other health information
- We may collect some or all of the following information if you are screened for treatment using one of our AlphaID™ tests:

- Genetic data (e.g., information about genetic markers that are tested using an AlphaID™ test, such as genetic markers associated with COPD)
- Data that identifies a consumer seeking health care services (e.g., the fact that you are being screened using AlphaID™)
- Other information that may be used to infer, derive, or extrapolate data related to the above or other health information (e.g., the fact that you are being screened using AlphaID™ or visiting the AlphaID™ website)

Sources of CHD

As described further in our [Privacy Policy | Grifols Plasma](#) (we collect information that may include CHD from the following sources: (1) directly from you; (2) automatically through your use of our websites and apps; and (3) other sources such as our affiliates.

Purposes for Collection of CHD

We describe the purposes for collection and use of CHD in the “How We Use Your Information” section of our Privacy Policy. As further described there and subject to applicable law, we may collect and use CHD as directed by you or with your consent, or (1) to provide and manage the Services, including to communicate with you; (2) to analyze and improve the Services; (3) for research and development, including to create new products and services; (4) for marketing and advertising purposes; and (5) for legal purposes, such as to comply with applicable laws or to establish, exercise, or defend our legal rights.

How and Why We Share CHD

We may share each of the categories of CHD described above for business purposes to the categories of entities described in the “When We Disclose Your Information” section of our Privacy Policy. As further described in our Privacy Policy and subject to applicable law, we may share the categories of CHD:

- To provide and manage the Services;
- To engage in research, development, analytics, marketing, and advertising;
- To enable our vendors to provide us with services that allow us to operate our Services, such as data storage, research and development, billing, marketing, analytics, and customer service;
- With your consent, such as disclosures for certain advertising efforts, including allowing third parties to collect CHD across our Websites;
- To protect us and others, including to enforce our Terms of Use, Privacy Policy, or other contracts with you, and for fraud prevention;
- To comply with our legal obligations; and
- In connection with any negotiation or completed acquisition, merger, or purchase involving our business assets.

As described in our Privacy Policy, we reserve the right to create aggregate/de-identified data from the information we collect through the Services and our disclosure of such aggregate/de-identified data is in our discretion.

As further described in our Privacy Policy, and subject to applicable law (e.g. subject to your consent in certain situations), we may share CHD with the following categories of third parties and affiliates:

- Vendors and service providers;
- Advertising networks;
- For the protection of us and others (e.g., to governmental or regulatory agencies);
- For legal purposes (e.g., to governmental entities in response to legal process);
- As necessary for business transfers;
- At your direction or with your consent; and
- Our affiliate BPC Plasma, Inc.

How To Exercise Your Rights Under CHD Laws

Depending on your jurisdiction and subject to exceptions, the CHD Laws extend certain rights regarding CHD, which may include the right to request to (1) confirm whether we are collecting, sharing or selling your CHD; (2) access your CHD; (3) delete your CHD; and (4) withdraw your consent to the collection or sharing of your CHD. You can seek to exercise these rights by emailing us at US-privacyrights@grifols.com.

Depending on the nature of your request, we may contact you for further information if appropriate to authenticate your identity. **Note, however, that we will never ask you for sensitive personal or financial information when authenticating your identity, and none of our employees will ask you to tell them your password.**

If we deny your request in whole or in part, you may appeal that decision by emailing us at US-privacyrights@grifols.com. If you are a resident of Washington and your appeal is denied, you can contact the Washington State Attorney General at www.atg.wa.gov/file-complaint. If you are a resident of Nevada and your appeal is denied, you can contact the Nevada Attorney General at https://ag.nv.gov/Complaints/File_Complaint/.

Updates to this CHD Policy

We reserve the right to change this CHD Policy at any time to reflect changes in the law, our data collection and use practices, the features of our Services, or advances in technology. We will make the revised CHD Policy accessible through the Services, so you should review it periodically. The date this CHD Policy was last revised is identified at the top of the document. You are responsible for periodically monitoring and reviewing any updates to the CHD Policy. If we make a material change to the CHD Policy, we will provide you with appropriate notice in accordance with legal requirements. Your continued use of our Services after such amendments

(and notice, where applicable) will be deemed your acknowledgment of these changes to this CHD Policy.
